

Students were fascinated to learn how digital professionals use creativity and technology to solve real-world problems — and how these skills are highly valued in today's job market.

The BIMA Challenges: Aston Martin & HelloFresh

Students then took on two exciting real-world challenges set by global brands Aston Martin and HelloFresh.

The Aston Martin Challenge asked students to develop digital ideas to support the launch of the company's new car — finding creative ways to engage younger audiences and build excitement online.

The HelloFresh Challenge focused on coming up with innovative digital solutions to help the brand reach new customers and promote healthy, sustainable eating through technology.

Working in small teams, pupils brainstormed ideas, created digital campaign concepts, and developed marketing strategies before presenting their final pitches to Reading Room's judges.

Teamwork, Innovation, and Inspiration

The creativity and confidence shown by our students were outstanding. From interactive mobile apps and social media campaigns to eco-friendly marketing ideas, every group demonstrated teamwork, problem-solving, and presentation skills that truly impressed the judges.

The Reading Room team praised the students' ability to think like professionals — combining creativity with digital awareness and real-world relevance.


Inspiring Digital Futures

CAREERS FOCUS – IT and the Internet

What is IT?

IT is basically the technology that powers our lives. Not just the apps we use but the hardware too, computers, smartphones, tablets and even the servers the internet runs on.

The digital sector is all about using tech for marketing, design, and communication. It is where creativity meets analytics to connect brands with audiences online.

What skills will I need? Some examples:

Analytical thinking

Analytical thinking involves breaking down complex problems and finding solutions. They are key in tech, helping you make data driven decisions and optimise processes.

Communication

Communication skills are essential in tech.
Whether collaborating on projects or explaining complex ideas, being able to convey your thoughts clearly makes a huge difference.

Creativity

Creativity fuels innovation in tech. It allows you to think outside the box, come up with unique solutions and design engaging experiences that resonate with users.

Logical thinking

Logical thinking is about solving problems systematically. It is crucial in tech roles, helping you make sense of data and develop efficient solutions to challenges.

Problem solving

Problem solving is all about tackling challenges head on. In tech, this skill means identifying issues and coming up with practical solutions to keep things running smoothly.

What apprenticeships can I do?

You can dive straight into a tech career with apprenticeships like cyber security technologist (level 4) or software developer (level 4) to kickstart your journey.

Is uni an option?

Yes, university is a solid choice if you are looking for in depth knowledge. Degrees in computer science or digital marketing can set you up for a bright future.

What professional qualifications can I gain?

You can earn qualifications like Chartered IT Professional (CITP) from the British Computer Society. These boost your credibility and skills in the tech industry.
