Dear St John Plessington Catholic College Community,

What an energetic and spiritually enriching start to the term we've experienced! I'm delighted to share some wonderful moments from our school community.

Our recent Open Morning was a fantastic opportunity to showcase St John Plessington in full operation, allowing prospective students and families to see the vibrant learning environment we've created.

A particularly special moment last week was the Pilgrimage of the Jubilee Icon to our school. Bishop Mark blessed this precious icon, and we celebrated with a beautiful Celebration of the Word involving our staff and students. Our team then travelled to St John's Juniors to pass the icon along its diocesan journey.

We've also had some remarkable student experiences. Our Alton Towers rewards trip was a highlight, recognising and celebrating student achievements. Our Year 12 students embarked on an Emmaus walk, a profound spiritual journey that symbolises the disciples encountering the risen Christ. This pilgrimage reflects the deeper faith and personal growth we encourage in our students.

The Diocese of Shrewsbury's Year 7 Retreat, delivered by the Youth Mission team, has been instrumental in supporting our newest students as they begin their spiritual journey with us. These sessions, being delivered across Year 7 forms, will continue next week, and we're looking forward to hearing more about the students' experiences.

Attendance remains a critical focus for us. The majority of our students have made an excellent start, with superb attendance levels. We want to emphasise that while 100% attendance is ideal, maintaining attendance above 97% is crucial for academic attainment. We've noticed a concerning trend of increased absences on Fridays, and we'll be monitoring this closely. Again, to highlight, the proposed industrial action by Stagecoach has been cancelled.

Our Heads of Learning and pastoral teams are committed to supporting students and breaking down any barriers to ensure consistent attendance. We encourage all our students to attend school every day and maximise their learning opportunities.


The trip was organised to celebrate and recognise the commitment of our pupils who consistently attend school, demonstrating dedication to their learning and making the most of every opportunity.

It's an exciting time in the Art Department, and we're incredibly proud of these talented young artists as they continue to showcase their creativity and imagination.




Chaplaincy

This week the Gospel to Life sessions have been about Oscar Romero, the namesake of one of our houses. Romero was a quiet and scholarly person who from an early age displayed a great commitment to spiritual life.

Eventually he was chosen to lead the Church in his native El Salvador as archbishop. He was chosen because people thought he was "safe" and he would side with the powerful interest and wealthy people in his country which at the time was ravaged by a civil war between Marxist rebels and authoritarian right-wingers.

Romero preached peace, justice, reconciliation. He did not pick sides but always raised his voice for the poor and marginalised and ministered to them. Eventually, forces of the government decided to silence him. They threatened him, imprisoned him, humiliated him. Eventually they hired people to assassinate him while he was celebrating the Mass, that symbol of Christian love and service.

Romero is an example of following Christ's call to pursue justice which we can all do in our lives, even if we do not face the terrible situation Romero faced. We can, every day, make a decision to work for a better world through dialogue and reconciliation between people. Next Wednesday we will celebrate our school Mass at 1445.
