

### **Sport Success**









Year 7's in Mr Jones' RE class have been Bible journaling the Christmas story. This beautiful piece of work was designed by Oakley.


#### **RELIGIOUS EDUCATION: MYSTERY PLAYS**

## Careers Focus – Sports and Fitness

Can you do this?

If you have an interest in sport, it may have derived from watching one of your family members playing a particular sport and possibly even being paid to do so. You may enjoy playing sport yourself, or just enjoy the excitement of watching it. Whatever the reason, if sport does excite you, you will be amazed at the range of future jobs available to you.

Becoming a 'professional' in any sport is incredibly hard work and requires a lot of dedication, usually from a very early age, but it can be done. The current reality is that less than 0.5% of young football players signed up (before they are nine years old) by a big club ever play for the first team at that club – and they are the elite players of their age groups. However, like someone once said 'There is a chance'. So if you are really good at your sport and want to make it, work hard and practice, practice, practice. Some of our former students have made it as athletes and professional footballers (Lewis Koumas at SJP is a recent example, James Clarke from SMCC). Some have even excelled on the world stage, such as Lee Charles - six times world kick-boxing champion.

Aside from actually playing sport, at any level, the range of jobs associated with 'sports and fitness' provides a plethora of opportunities.

These include roles such as sports coaches

and instructors, sports referees, PE teachers, personal trainers, sports psychologists, sports commentators, fitness trainers and so on (see the National Careers link for more detail and examples). For most of these jobs, a sound knowledge of the sport and/or fitness/physiology, relevant qualifications and the ability to communicate well are all important prerequisites to success.
